Each year around this time, we ask Engage attendees to share about how Engage has impacted their lives. These stories provide a great picture of what God is doing at Engage and how He is using this ministry.

As you read these stories, thank God for using Engage to make Himself real to so many people, and know that you are a part of all God is doing at Engage.

The reason I come to Engage is that I have never felt so convicted and impacted from such an unconventional Bible study. ... I grew up in the church and went to a very fundamental school. I know I was taught a lot of things that are false, and I pray that God would show me true Christianity unhindered by the tainted mind of man. And as an artist, I've always searched for unconventional, untraditional ways of doing and seeing things, and that is what brought me to Engage. The speakers have said things that have made me feel somewhat uncomfortable, but what they say is extremely true. Basically, they're not afraid to say what I'm thinking. It's refreshing to hear basic doctrines told in a completely different way from what I'm used to. And their messages are so much more creative, relevant and passionate than what I'm used to hearing. It's not that I'm just looking for the same story told in a different way. It's that I'm hearing Scripture spoken in ways that make my ears twitch and my heart beat faster. I'm so used to Christianity being a certain way, molded into a box with directions on how to use it written on the side. I know that's not what Christianity is. I know God is dangerous, unpredictable, unconventional and completely antithetical to everything we think, but He is good and is completely in love with us. It's great to see people throw the directions away and come at Him fresh and thirsty. God has spoken to me through Engage, and I'm glad to hear it. - Marco

I feel that Engage is a FANTASTIC ministry and want your supporters to know what an impact they are having in the lives of young people! I started going to Engage when I met at Southside. I was living in Seneca at the time and working in Greenville, so it was extremely difficult to make the drive late at night.

I eventually stopped going and sort of forgot about it. ... After graduating from Clemson and being involved with Campus Crusade for Christ, it was REALLY HARD not having that fellowship in the "real" world. I don't think that ministries in college really prepare you for the "real" world, or either I was naive enough to think that I would always be surrounded by a strong group of Christians who could invest in my life and encourage my walk! I didn't find that when I graduated! I think Engage is an AWESOME ministry because I've found that most churches don't really focus much energy into young adults, and I believe the staff of Engage has really stepped up to the plate and is filling a HUGE gap present in the church today. God is really using this ministry and has changed my heart TREMENDOUSLY over the past few weeks ... Thank you SO MUCH for all you do! I truly believe that God has blessed this ministry and its staff as they reach out to young adults in the Greenville area! Thank you again for all of the sacrifices and for being available week after week! - Rachel

Two years ago, I was feeling very dry spiritually. I was part of a Bible study, but it felt more like a gab session, and I wanted something deeper. I was feeling too dry to try and help turn the Bible study I was in more in that direction, and I was looking for a place where I could be fed spiritually. Several friends had been to Engage, and one even played in the praise band, so I finally decided to check it out. I was amazed! From my first visit, there was at least one thing each week that touched me right where I was. Sometimes it was a song. Sometimes it was something said in the praise and worship. Sometimes it was a challenge in the message. Engage helped me "get back on track" spiritually. I couldn't wait to go each

week to learn more and to worship. In addition, it was a great encouragement to see so many young singles out on a Tuesday night worshipping the Lord! - Renee

Engage to me is my fuel. I am hungry for God and don't get what I need from my home church. I use Engage as my fuel for what I need in my life and as my challenge to learn and stay close to God. I love Engage and pray that everyone who's a part of it will continue to do an outstanding job. Thanks again for all you do. - Mitch

The reason I go to Engage is that it makes me feel closer to God, and it also helps me turn away from other things that I might think are more important. It makes me realize that there is nothing more important than being in God's amazing presence. I love how "un-religious" Engage is. I mean irreligious not in a bad way - I've been to churches that say don't do this and don't do that, but Engage is so open to everything, and it has made me realize that God is that way. He is the amazing Father who is open to everything. 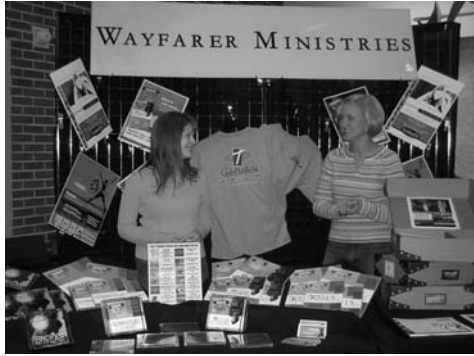
