



WAYFARER COOKING UP FISH FOOD

One of the heartbeats of Wayfarer Ministries is to find ways to communicate who God is and what He's doing in fresh ways. You can see this creativity and innovation in many areas of our ministry -- at Engage and Sabbath, in our writing projects, and even on our ministry websites.

A little more than a year ago, Wayfarer got the opportunity to partner with Campus Revolution on a new devotional product for students and their families that would harness technology and allow the students to do their daily devotions on their computer or even on an iPod or MP3 player.

Now this project -- called Fish Food -- is a reality. Starting on December 11, students from dozens of churches will log onto getfishfood.com to download their daily devotion and encounter our revolutionary God in a revolutionary way.

So how does Fish Food work? Each month, Fish Food posts a themed four-week series. We begin each series with a video that students watch on-line to kick off the series. These creative videos are of top quality -- so much so that one of them, the Old School video, became a top hit on YouTube.com this fall, drawing more than one million views.

During the week, students can

download five daily devotions, either in text form via a PDF file or in audio form via an MP3 file. Each devotion includes a daily challenge called the 24 that is designed to help students see at least one practical way they can



apply what God is showing them that day.

We believe that Fish Food is on the cutting edge of spiritual formation. It helps students engage God together with a parent or mentor so that they can talk about what they're learning and even do this learning together. It also helps students engage God in the ways they connect best with culture. We've discovered that there's a power in an audio devotion that is different and often deeper than

simple text can create.

Fish Food is currently in a beta season, and a second one begins in April. In each season, we're doing four series. They are:

XXXMas: Discovering the scandal of the Christmas story.

In this series, we look at how God broke the rules of nature, society, and religion not only at Jesus' birth but throughout His life so that He could reach all of us with His scandalous love.

Old School: Today's questions, yesterday's stories. In this series, we look at Old Testament stories and see how they address the questions we face everyday.

Wanted: In between lost and found. In this series, we find out how truly wanted we are by God.

iMatter: We all matter to God. In this series, we see how iMatter and how this starts a revolution in our lives and our world.

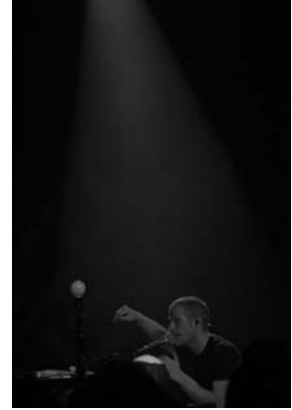
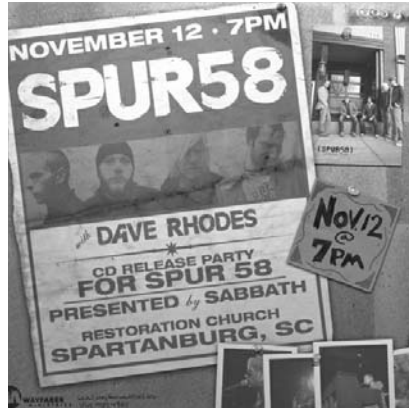
SPUR 58, CHRIS BROOKS LEAD 15 CHURCHES AT SABBATH

ENGAGE FALL REVIEW: DUMPSTER DIVING, TALES OF A WAYFARER AND ONE WET NIGHT

It's amazing how quickly the Engage fall season has come and gone. It's been a great ride this fall, and we wanted to share a little bit of it with you.

Our first series of the fall was Dumpster Diving. It was about stumbling into God in unexpected places. For six weeks, we looked at how we encounter God through His provision, through pain, through unexpected circumstances, through unexpected people, in silence, and in the noise of our culture. It was amazing to see how often God showed up in the middle of this series.

Our other fall series was Tales of a Wayfarer. In this series, we looked at what the life of following God really looks like by journeying through Joshua's story and connecting it to our lives. We stopped at the mileposts of preparation, courage, temptation, miracles, and legacy as we discovered what it looks like for us

to write a story with God in our lives.

This fall at Engage also saw the launch of a new idea called the Afterparty. The Afterparty is an on-line resource designed to help members of the Engage community build on what we learn in the room on Tuesday nights and take it outside of the room into our everyday lives and into our world.

The centerpiece of the Afterparty are devotions and daily challenges through which people can think more about what they're learning and then have a practical step they can take each day to put it into action. You can check out the Engage Afterparty on-line at www.EngageGod.org.

Engage also played a huge part in Wayfarer's fall fundraiser. In 2005, we did a golf marathon, and about a dozen players helped us raise several thousand dollars. This year, to get more people involved, we invited the Engage community to join us for a putt-putt marathon. Our goal was to raise \$30,000 through this event.

When November 7, the night of the putt-putt marathon, arrived, it came with some of the worst weather you'll ever see. It was rainy and cold -- far from ideal putt-putt conditions. Still, about 50 people from the Engage community showed up to play putt-putt and earn their per-hole

pledges. Thanks to the dedication of these people and the generosity of many friends, we were able to reach our fundraising goal of
